

The Yadkin River Trail

The Yadkin River Trail is a Class I-II 165 mile river trail, rich in natural beauty and American history. From the connection to Daniel Boone who called the river basin his home, to Revolutionary War History related to the Overmountain Victory National Historic Trail which followed its shores to the battle on Kings Mountain, SC; the river could tell us a century's worth of stories.

With primarily Class I rapids through the Ronda to Rockford section (18 miles of trail), but with some classic V-rapids, beginners to experienced paddlers can enjoy a day on the Yadkin River. Beginners should always travel with an experienced paddler however!

There are various combinations of float opportunities supported by good access and take-out locations. Start up stream at Ronda and descend the river to Elkin, take out at the new boat ramp in Elkin, or just jump out for a short walk and bite to eat in downtown Elkin before descending further to either Yadkin Shores in Boonville or on to Rockford.

Birders and wildlife enthusiasts will also enjoy this relaxing stretch of river. Otter, deer and other wildlife can be viewed as well as numerous bird species including herons, egrets and kingfisher. The avid fisherman will find small mouth, large mouth, redeyes and catfish.
